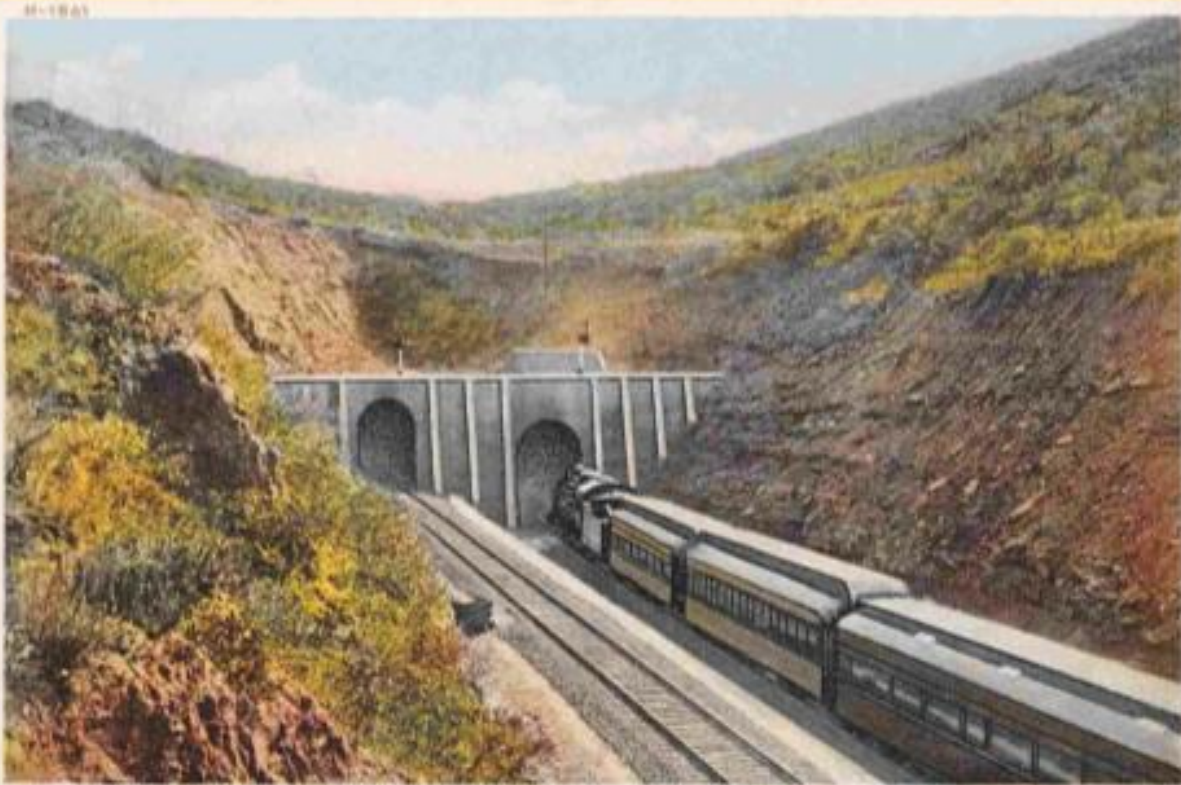

Located along New Mexico's border with Colorado, Colfax County is diverse in geography, culture, and commerce.

• **1 Sugarite Canyon State Park** Nature enthusiasts can appreciate abundant wildlife, birds, butterflies, and flora among the lakes, creeks, forests, and meadows. Many outdoor recreation activities are possible:

• **2 Cimarron Canyon State Park** This breathtaking canyon park has numerous trails, campsites and day use areas. 8 miles of great trout fishing in the Cimarron River flows at the bottom of the Palisades Sill.

• **3 Eagle Nest Lake State Park** 2,000 acre impoundment along Hwy 64 is one of the state's premier kokanee and trout lakes. Fishing is good in open water or through ice.

• **4 Philmont Scout Ranch** Check out the National Scouting Museum, Tooth of Time Traders Gear Store, Villa Philmonte, Kit Carson Museum, and the Chase Ranch.

• **5 Angel Fire Vietnam Veterans Memorial** includes a visitor center, museum, library, memorabilia exhibits, touchable displays, artwork, and sculptures that provide a glimpse into the daily life of our troops. There is an amphitheater, a memorial walkway and gardens, a Huey Helicopter display, and more.

• **6 Angel Fire Resort** An all-season resort in the Rocky Mountains. It offers outdoor recreational amenities for visitors of all ages, such as Snowsports, biking, golf, fishing and more.

• **7 Maxwell National Wildlife Refuge**

it was est. in 1965 as a feeding and resting area for migratory birds. Over 350 acres of the refuge are planted with wheat, corn, barley, and alfalfa to provide food for resident and migratory wildlife.

• **8 Old Aztec Mill Museum** The mill was built in 1864 to grind grains for the Maxwell Ranch, the Jicarilla Apache Indian Reservation, and Santa Fe Trail travelers.

• **9 St. James (Don Diego) Hotel**

Henri Lambert, who had been President Abraham Lincoln's personal chef, established a saloon here in 1872. By 1880, the saloon had evolved into the 2-story, Adobe Street James Hotel.

• **10 Raton Country Club** This is a public, nine-hole course in the foothills of the Rockies. This course has beautiful scenery where wildlife can be seen year round. Rooms available for meetings and special occasions

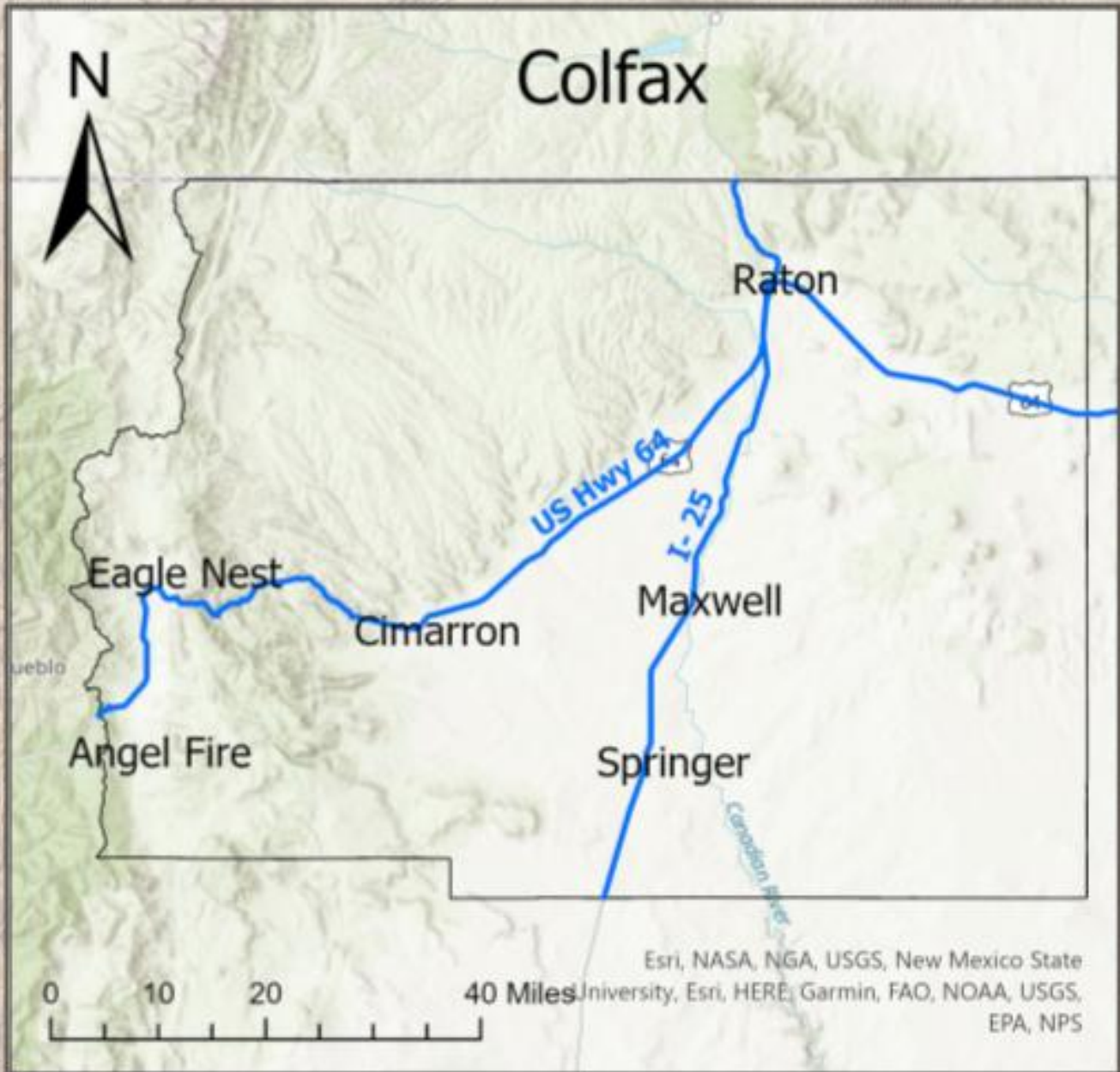

• **11 Santa Fe Trail Museum** Housed in the former Colfax County Courthouse, it includes many art exhibits pertaining to the Santa Fe Trail and early pioneering life.
